Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

<sup>30</sup> Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. 31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

# The Great Thanksgiving

From the Anglican Church of South Africa

We do this in remembrance of Jesus; his risen life revealed in the breaking of the bread.

So we proclaim the mystery of faith. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

As we proclaim his death, and celebrate his rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit, that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink this holy food, send your Spirit upon us, and make us one in Christ, our Risen Lord. Alleluia!

#### March 2025 Financial Overview

Compared to last year our deficit in March is slightly higher than in March 2024.

This is likely due to a colder and snowier March. Easter was in March last year, so our income was higher than this March.

We also cancelled a service this March.

Overall, for the first three months of 2025 we are down \$7,163.60 from our deficit amount for the same time period last year.
